Many homeless people in Detroit recognize **Father Marko Djonovic’s** white Ford Excursion. When he rolls up with his friend Marcus Cobb, it’s because they have a job to offer in exchange for lunch and pay. Fr. Marko’s new ministry, **“Better Way Detroit,”** provides homeless workers to clean up the city’s parks, alleys, and vacant lots. He discovered that many of the homeless had a strong work ethic and a desire to work for pay.

Father Marko, ordained in May 2013, is a part of the newly formed Congregation of the Oratory of St. Philip Neri at Our Lady of the Rosary Parish. He feels privileged to work alongside the homeless; he gets to know their story and they get to know his.

Every project concludes with lunch and a reflection on a Bible reading. Prayer cards are handed out and the ministry does its best to connect the homeless to housing, healthcare services, or other resources they need. One man said he felt “blessed” to be a part of something positive, instead of just looking for money in his pocket.

Father will share with us his special devotion to Our Lady and how it affects his calling to ministry.
